Eric Wenocur said he was glad to meet neighbors from other areas of the neighborhood. "The dog owners seem to know each other, but for the rest of us it's not easy to meet neighbors who aren't on your street." Several attendees suggested that the meet-up become an annual event, and to involve more people in the planning.
